



In September, I had the pleasure of attending and speaking at several chapter meetings. These included:


- Bayonne Chapter's monthly meeting

There is an old proverb: "Be not afraid of growing slowly; be afraid only of standing still."



We can be sure that heaven will surpass all our hopes and expectations. There will be love, joy and peace far greater than any we can experience here on earth. Since heaven will be more wonderful than we can possibly imagine, God uses images that we are familiar with to give us some idea about it. Those images include among other things: a great banquet, a wedding feast, the elimination of suffering and death. We might say that heaven will be the party to end all parties.

This month we celebrate Thanksgiving, which is much like a feast. Feasts recall times of joy in our lives, of families gathered together eating in celebration. Isaiah wrote about the "day of the Lord," which will occur at the end of time. It will be a period of reward for the righteous but punishment for unrepentant sinners. Isaiah foresaw Zion, a "mountain" near Jerusalem, where righteous people of all nations will live forever in perfect union with God, enjoying a great feast. So, how do we get an invitation to this feast?

It is easier than you might think, but we must remain open and ready. No one is excluded; all are invited and are welcome to the Lord's banquet. In the parable of the wedding feast, Jesus tells us how we should respond to the invitation that he extends to us. Several people who were invited to a wedding ignored the invitation due to what appeared to be valid reasons. One man went to his estate, another to his business, a third to fulfill domestic obligations. The parable is a reminder that, at times, we can become so preoccupied with things of this world, even legitimate things, that we neglect spiritual things. We might be listening so intently to what society tells us that we fail to hear Jesus' invitation to share in his salvation.

In Jesus' time, to refuse an invitation from a king, whether by intention or negligence, was an act of rebellion. Refusing God's invitation reflects a serious lack of faith and generosity. In the parable, those who were gathered in from the byways had no claim on the king. Likewise, we have no claim on God. We do not earn his invitation; it is a gift, something that he lovingly offers to us. He does not make a daunting obstacle course for us to master before he will allow us into heaven. He does not make it difficult for us to accept his invitation, but we must accept it properly. Our response cannot be half-hearted and/or unenthusiastic. All he wants us to do is to believe that Jesus has saved us and to try our best to obey the commandments and to follow Jesus' example to the best of our ability. If we do that, we will have a place at the eternal banquet in heaven, the greatest feast of all time!



I am looking forward to seeing everyone at the Eastern Regional Meeting at the Embassy Suites in Parsippany New Jersey!





We had an M&R training session at the home office in Fairfield on September 27th which was attended by about 30 members remotely and a few at the office, (thank you Ed for the pastry, you know who you are). Columbus is Back: City of Garfield Restores Prominence of the Garfield UNICO Columbus Statue

GARFIELD, NJ — On Sunday, October 12, 2025, residents, civic leaders, and members of the Italian American community gathered at the entrance of Columbus Park for a historic moment—the rededication of the Garfield UNICO Christopher Columbus statue, restored to a place of honor at the park's gateway.

The Columbus statue was originally unveiled by the Garfield Chapter of UNICO National on October 15, 1967, when the park was first dedicated as Columbus Park. For over five decades, the statue served as a symbol of Italian American pride, civic heritage, and community identity in Garfield. The site hosted annual Columbus Day wreath-laying ceremonies ever since becoming an enduring landmark in the city's history.



In 2024, finalization of major renovations altered the park's layout, and the statue was moved to the rear of the grounds near the train tracks, significantly diminishing its visibility and historic significance. Around the same time, the park's name— "Columbus Park"— was removed, sparking immediate concern among many residents and community leaders who viewed the changes as a dismissal of Garfield's Italian American history.

Public response was swift and determined. Mayor Everett E. Garnto, Jr., Deputy Mayors, and the Garfield City Council worked closely with Garfield UNICO Chairman, Allan B. Focarino, heritage advocates, and residents to restore both the park's identity and the statue location. On January 10, 2025, the Council passed a resolution officially reinstating the park's original and historic name: Columbus Park.

On October 6, 2025, the statue itself was relocated to the park's main entrance at Midland Avenue and Outwater Lane — near its original

position. The effort was made possible through the generosity of Zuccaro & Sons, Inc., whose owner Salvatore Zuccaro and his family provided equipment and support for the move at no cost to the city. Community members applauded




as the monument once again greeted visitors as a dignified symbol of Garfield's cultural heritage.

The official rededication took place on October 12, 2025, when state and county officials, community leaders, and residents gathered for a celebratory ceremony.

Garfield UNCO Columbus Chairman Allan Focarino opened the ceremony with comments that included: "What Christopher Columbus accomplished in the 15th century may have been a greater achievement than landing on the moon in the 20th century. His journey represents courage, exploration, and the pursuit of opportunity—values that continue to inspire us today."

Assemblyman Abdelaziz presented a New Jersey State Senate and Assembly Joint Proclamation recognizing the work of Garfield UNICO and its Columbus Committee. County Executive Tedesco followed with a county proclamation honoring Columbus Day and preservation of Italian American heritage. County Administrator Tom Duch presented remarks and a proclamation on behalf of the Bergen County Board of Commissioners. Mayor Garnto then issued a City of Garfield Proclamation honoring the dedication of Garfield UNICO and





Allan B. Focarino, a long-standing advocate for cultural history and preservation in Garfield.

Mayor Garnto addressed the crowd, stating: "This statue is more than stone—it is a tribute to faith, family, and the immigrant journey that contributed to this city. Today we honor those who stood up to protect history and community pride. I proudly recognize the steadfast commitment of Allan B. Focarino, Garfield UNICO, and our city leadership, whose dedication made this historic restoration possible."



Garfield UNICO President Louise Gerardi and Garfield's Columbus Chairman Allan B. Focarino presented plaques of appreciation to Mayor Garnto and Salvatore Zuccaro for their leadership and generous support. Gerardi stated: "We are honored by the overwhelming support of the community. The relocation of the Columbus statue and the restoration of Columbus Park reflect a deep respect for history and tradition. Columbus continues to stand proud in Garfield"

Frank LoRé, Ralph Contini, and Dominick Nicastro also addressed the large group of supporters acknowledging the efforts of Garfield's Columbus Chair and committee in spearheading the statue relocation and park name restoration by the city.

51st Annual Labor Day Italian Festival



Once again, the annual Labor Day Festival held at St. Bartholomew the Apostle Church entertained thousands of visitors near and far over the span of four evenings. The sights, sounds, smells, and smiles were out in full force from opening night until the festival's closing moments on Labor Day.



Festival patrons enjoyed the beautiful weather as they feasted on sausage and pepper sand-wiches, pizza, pastries, and zeppoles and walked the festival grounds with family and friends. Along the way, they were sure to purchase their Super 50/50 tickets for a chance at this year's jackpot, which reached over \$76,000. Festival volunteers donated their time and talents to work the games and rarely had a lull in the action. Children of all ages had their choice of rides such as the teacup ride and the Ferris Wheel. Visitors were also treated to a variety of entertainers: Wolf Creek, Anthony Liguori as Elvis, The Broadcasters, and Jimmy and the Parrots.



As is festival tradition, the Saturday 5 pm Italian mass was celebrated by Father Matthew Gonzalez and assisted by Father Frank Rose and Deacon Bob Gurske, who read the Gospel in both Italian and English. Bishop Elias Lorenzo and Deacons Don Hessemer, Cesar Monge, and German Gonzalez were also in attendance. Following the mass, a procession with the two festival patron saints, St. Bartholomew and St. Nicholas of Bari, was led through the festival grounds. Visitors then sang both the American and Italian national anthems to conclude the ceremony, and the festival continued throughout the evening.



When all was said and done, the festival co-sponsors - St. Bart's Church, Scotch-Plains Fanwood UNICO, and St. Bartholomew Academy - celebrated yet another memorable festival weekend. All festival proceeds will benefit the three co-sponsors and will help with parish and school programs and UNICO scholarships. St. Bart's and Scotch Plains-Fanwood UNICO would like to extend a special thank you to the festival committee and the festival volunteers, all of whom helped make this year's festival a huge success.



Farrell called her mother Josephine "a powerhouse and truly one of a kind", saying that her mother never missed school and took great care of their family, especially in times of need. She also mentioned how her father, Lawrence (also born in Pescopagano), built their house in Scotch Plains in 1956, adding, "Italians don't hire contractors. They are the contractors." She noted that she and her husband still visit Pescopagano every summer for six weeks in a small house they've owned for years. Farrell's recounting of her family history was equally humorous, amazing, and touching.



In addition to the featured speaker, audience members also heard remarks from Scotch Plains Mayor Josh Losardo; Union County Commissioner Alexander Mirabella; UNICO National Past President Anthony Bengivenga; Knights of Columbus representative Andy MacDonald; and Italian American Club President Gregg Di Francesco. SOUTHINGTON, CT




The UNICO Club of Southington hosted a cultural event in the fall in celebration of Italian traditions with a special nod to the region of Campania.
